As soon as is possible we request that family members **notify the Post via telephone** (listed on

our website) if a comrade has passed away. Too many times we must rely on seeing an obituary in the newspaper which leaves little or no time for members to pay their final respects. The Post Color Guard is ready to pay final respects at the wake and render a 21-gun salute and the playing of taps at the cemetery.

FAREWELL ARTHUR HEIDEMANN

Former Commander Arthur Heidemann (1978-1979) passed away on September 9 2024 at age 87. The Post Color Guard rendered a final salute. He retired from the Navy in 1974, serving as a Seabee. Interesting enough, his brother John also served as our Commander from 1956-1957.

BURIAL PLOTS

Do you know that the Post is in possession of 9 cemetery plots in Memory Gardens Cemetery on Euclid just west of Rand Road? These are available to Post members and their families. Here are their locations and numbers of plots:

- 1. Vet Honors, Lot 274, Block B, Space 1. It has a double concrete vault which allows 2 casket burials or 3 cremation burials.
- 2. Garden of the Apostles, Lot 155, Block B, Spaces 1-4. No vaults, one burial per space.
- 3. Garden of Savior, Lot 58, Block B, Spaces 1-4. No vaults, one burial per space.

The process for obtaining title to any of these is a visit to the cemetery with an officer of the Post. Note that there are other expenses associated with using the plots.

- 1. Opening and closing of the grave.
- 2. Purchasing a concrete vault for the ones without one.
- 3. Vault handling fee
- 4. Grave marker. For veterans, it would be the granite base to accommodate the bronze marker the government provides. For non-

veterans it would include the marker and base.

POST POPPY DONATIONS

At the August meeting the Post donated the money collected this year at Memorial Day to the following veteran's charities:

- 1. K9's For Veterans which provides service dogs.
- 2. Bravehearts Therapeutic Riding and Educational Center which connects veterans and their families with horses.
- 3. Midwest Veterans Closet which helps veterans needing furnishing for their dwellings.

Each received a check for \$1,500.
